18,060 girls and women were counseled at the border this year.

864 victims were rescued and are now overcomers!

146 overcomers were welcomed as daughters at the Safe Homes.

111 daughters received vocational skill training.

239 girls are receiving education support.

15 new businesses were started.

Women's Entrepreneur Society Nepal was established.

U.S. partner teams led Daughter
Empowerment Conferences, trauma
counseling training and cosmetology training.







BORDER STATIONS

10 Border Stations and two Train Depots span

the entire India-Nepal border where Border Counselors, many who were once victims themselves, monitor traffic. If a victim is identified, they are rescued. If safety, trauma, or other issues prevent her from being reunited with her family, she is given the opportunity to continue her journey to freedom and is welcomed as a daughter at the Safe Homes.



2023 IMPACT

51,059 girls and women received information regarding human trafficking, genderbased violence and child marriage.

18,060 girls and women were counseled at the border.

706 girls and women were reunited with their families.

864 victims were rescued as overcomers!

51 Border Counselors and staff keep a watchful eye for potential victims year-round.

RAJITA'S STORY

The Birgunj rescue team was contacted by police regarding a young woman they had found in distress. They were unable to ascertain her story and hoped the rescue team would have more success. When the team arrived, they saw a woman who looked disheveled and exhausted. They decided to take her back to the Emergency Shelter so she could have a place to recover. She slept for an entire day after her rescue.

When the young woman woke, she shared through tears that her name was Rajita. She had gone to a friend's house and was offered a cup of tea that had been secretly drugged. The next thing she remembered was waking in a strange place full of strange people. While unconscious, Rajita had been transported to an exotic dance club by her traffickers and was now surrounded by other victims. For five agonizing years, Rajita was forced to work endless nights and never received a penny. She was forbidden to leave for any reason. One day, Rajita saw a chance to escape. She ran for four straight hours when the police found her and contacted our partners for help.

Rajita told the border team that she had a son back home and desperately wanted to see him again. With the help of Nepali police, they located her family and facilitated her homecoming. The team keeps frequent communication with Rajita who is living safely with her parents. They provide ongoing counseling and support, and will continue to do so until Rajita is able to overcome her dark past and move towards healing and restoration.

2 RESTORE DAUGHTERS

SAFE HOMES

When an overcomer arrives at one of the two Safe Homes, she is welcomed as "our daughter." Her basic needs are met and one-on-one trauma counseling is started right away. During her two to three month stay, she is eventually matched to a counselor who will help her dream and put a plan together for a bright future.

2023 IMPACT

146 overcomers were welcomed as daughters at the **two Safe Homes**.

73 daughters graduated from the Safe Homes.

31 daughters were reintegrated into their families and communities.

18 staff members serve our daughters.



SITA'S STORY

Sita's family lived in extreme poverty.

Desperate to help, she agreed to go with a friend to work as a waiter in a hotel. When she arrived, she realized she had been deceived and sold instead to the hotel as a prostitute. Sita was forced to give herself up dozens of times per day without ever being able to leave the hotel. Sita began to accept that this was her fate now and she would likely never return to her old life.

Eventually, Sita's traffickers decided that she would be sold to a brothel in India. On her way, however, Sita was intercepted at the border by our partner's rescue team. They counseled her and told her they could help her create a new life. She led police back to the hotel where she had been working and four other young girls were rescued. The hotel owner was arrested for human trafficking.

Now, Sita is living in our partners' Education Home where she is studying Hospitality Management, and continues to receive counseling and care. She is a natural leader and has such a bright personality! She has reconnected with her family who offer their full support on her new journey. Sita also shares her story publicly to raise awareness about the vulnerabilities that lead to human trafficking, and to save other young girls and women like her!

3 EMPOWER LEADERS

TRAINING CENTER

Once the daughters graduate from the Safe Home, they continue their pathway to freedom at the Training Center. The daughters can enroll in one of four vocational skills training tracks;

Cosmetology • Tailoring • Fast Food • Electrician Training



2023 IMPACT

- 111 daughters received vocational skills training.
- 43 daughters graduated.
- **32 daughters** graduated from Social Leadership Training.
- **36 daughters** participated in Enhanced Leadership Training.



PRIYA'S STORY

Priya was rescued at the border after escaping her abusive husband. She wanted to create a better life for her son at home, so she accepted an offer to come to our partner's Training Center to learn vocational skills. While there, Priya gravitated towards the electrical training program and inspired everyone with her dedication to learn.

After graduation, Priya took a national exam for the "Electrical sub-overseer course" offered by the Council for Technical Education and Vocational Training. Out of 24 students, only three passed the exam.

Priya was one out of the three, and the only female, to pass with flying colors!

Priya has excelled so much that our partners have offered her a job at the Training Center as the assistant electrical trainer over the entire program! She now gets to use her knowledge to empower other daughters to dream big, reach high, and achieve their goals. She also gets to inspire her son everyday and give him the life she worked so hard to provide.



BUSINESSES AND

COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Once a daughter graduates from the Training Center, she returns to her community as an empowered leader. She will start her own business and engage the community through empowerment groups that reach women, men and adolescents. Through these groups, microsavings groups are also started, girls receive education scholarships, and awareness is raised surrounding the issues of human trafficking, gender-based violence and child marriage.

2023 IMPACT

15 new businesses were started.

131 Community Empowerment Groups have been started with 6.188 members.

24 Adolescent Groups reached 678 young girls.

42 Man Up Defender Groups mobilized 237 members.

239 girls received scholarships through NoChild.

4 Daughter Empowerment Conferences were hosted with 170 participants.



KAMA'S STORY

Kama grew up without ever experiencing the love of her family. As her parents aged, they became ill and could no longer work, so Kama was forced to quit school and become the sole provider. She heard she could find lucrative jobs in India, so she set out in search of a better life.


Kama was stopped on her way by our partners' border counselors who began asking her questions. She shared about her family's situation at home. The team invited Kama to come to the Training Center to begin learning vocational skills in a safe and loving environment. She happily accepted!

Kama excelled in the cosmetology track. Kama has now graduated from the Training Center, began working as a border counselor rescuing other girls like her, and has recently opened a salon in her village. She hopes to use her business as a way to inspire and encourage other women to start their own businesses.

RISE + SHINE EMPOWERMENT CONFERENCES

Over 200 daughters and staff members gathered together across four "Rise + Shine" Daughter Empowerment conferences hosted by our partners and led by various teams from our US ODI family.

Each conference was filled with friendship, fellowship, encouragement, learning and application.

Daughters returned to their communities **encouraged** and **empowered** to live out the plan and purpose for their lives.



A NEW BRAND AND EXPANSION PLAN

When a daughter opens a hairdressing business, she is able to make money the minute a client walks into her shop. This instant gratification gives her the encouragement she needs to keep going in her business, and provides a solid sustainable wage which is a huge human trafficking deterrent. Currently there are 13 successful salons up and running, but our partners have identified great demand in communities throughout the entire country of Nepal for skilled hairdressers!

A team from the US traveled to Nepal this fall and provided an entire week of training to daughters on the latest techniques in cutting, coloring and styling hair. They also worked with the business development team and created a business plan that would help scale these businesses. The goal is to start 20 new salons by the end of 2024 which would employ 40 new daughters!

What will they call this new shop? **Beauties + Bros!** We will keep you updated on developments of this exciting venture!









CHITWAN CHAAT HOUSE OPENED FOR BUSINESS

The Chaat House is a new fast food restaurant start-up this year. Its purpose is to provide jobs to daughters who have graduated from the fast food track, and to provide marketplace training to daughters in the last phase of their training. So far, the restaurant has been a success as it's nestled near a local college and med school. Needless to say, it serves many hungry students! The long term goal is to use the Chaat House as a model for multiple restaurants that use this concept to employ many daughters!

SERVE ELECTRIC NEPAL LAUNCHED

Also new this year was the launch of Serve Electric Nepal!

With the support of valued partner Serve Electric, a US-based electrical contractor business, the first Serve Electric Nepal storefront opened in the community. The store stocks and sells basic electrical supplies, and is also a service center where customers can schedule appointments for repairs by our electrical training graduates.

Serve Electric Nepal has created new opportunities to break gender stereotypes and demonstrate that our daughters are capable of doing anything!





The Women's Entrepreneur Society was established as a non-profit organization that will provide:

- 1 hands-on marketplace training for daughters,
- (2) financial support for daughters who start businesses,
- (3) ongoing business acumen support that will help them run their businesses effectively.

A portion of the businesses profits will be invested back into WES with the eventual goal of each business unit becoming financially independent. This will allow for additional business opportunities to be added to the organization.


The ultimate vision of WES is to establish daughter-run businesses throughout the entire country of Nepal that provide sustainable wages.




